<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Chair taking for legal review and will circle back at next SC. • Policy: Timetable (Mina Eusebio) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ CVP stated that overwhelming majority of students want to change exams to before winter break. ○ Vote to approve or reject: approved. • Policy: TU Dublin SU RAG Charity Expiring Policy (Beck Murphy) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Apologies from BM. ○ President stated that makes it easier for SU to have sole purpose that students support. ○ This streamlines RAG and fundraising. ○ Vote to approve or reject: approved. • Policy: TU Borrowing Framework (Naomi Sebastine) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ President explained framework, allows students to borrow money from government, policy ensures that SU enforces implementation of this wherever possible for accommodation etc. ○ Vote to approve or reject: approved. • Motion: Campus Commitment from TU Dublin (Mina Eusebio) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ CVP stated that this policy has TUD commit to the confirmation of the 5 campuses that would enshrine the status of the three city campuses as its own campus with appropriate investments. ○ Policy will encourage more lobbying opportunities for house committees and get more funding for those. ○ Councillor Christopher McL. asked about Blanch and CVP stated no negative impact for Blanch. President and VP for AA spoke for motion. ○ Vote to approve or reject: approved. • Motion: Turnitin (Anuoluwapo Dada) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ AD stated need for student body to have access to Turnitin through email address. ○ President stated that instead have open access to plagiarism check, i.e. Turnitin, so it is not limited. ○ Vote to change title to accommodate this change: approved. ○ Councillor Christopher McL. asked to have more transparency by asking professors for info. ○ VP AA said this might encourage plagiarism. ○ Councillor Georgina B. said understands desire for access but is doesn't think access to what lecturers use to grade is unnecessary. ○ AD countered that students should be able to ask for plagiarism score because of lack of transparency. Councillor Christopher McL. supported with the example of group projects. VP Welfare also supported. ○ Vote to approve or reject: approved. • Motion: Multifaith rooms in TU Dublin (Mina Eusebio) 	
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- CVP stated motion came from consultation with Islamic Society and were promised appropriate facilities. These needs have been unmet. Motion supports and reinforces TUD's commitment to all faiths.
- VP Welfare stated support.
- Vote to approve or reject: approved.
- **Motion:** Consent awareness at orientation (Mina Eusebio)
 - Motion stated motion came from TUD removing consent awareness from orientation.
 - Stated this is important because of a lack of uniformity in sex education across backgrounds.
 - Councillor Christopher McL. said consent awareness at orientation might not be enough and follow-ups would be good.
 - Councillor Aleksander B. against, stating that age diversity makes this training unsuitable and not so important as an introduction to the university.
 - Councillor Georgina B. counters that it is essential and age of consent across cultures is different, and this motion would encourage consistency.
 - President supported motion.
 - Vote to approve or reject: approved.

- **Motion:** Lobby earlier release of supplemental exam results (Naomi Sebastine)
 - President stated student desire to review academic calendar with emphasis on supplemental exam release dates and reinforce measures that prompt TUD to enforce deadlines as per academic calendar.
 - Councillor Christopher McL asked question about professors and exams generally and President emphasized this motion was specifically for supplemental exams.
 - Councillor Georgina B. expressed support.
 - CVP and VP Welfare support on basis of student awareness of whether they are progressing in their degree/for work opportunities.
 - Vote to approve or reject: approved.
- **Motion:** Accessible use of campus spaces for societies and cultural events (Sarvesh Modi)
 - SM stated that there is a lack of cultural-related events because campus spaces need to be booked in advanced and prices are high.



- Proposes that Exec and PTO for Ethnic Diversity work with TUD to fully subsidise or make free of charge for societies.
- CVP and VP Welfare support motion.
- CVP proposed that it be “supported by” PTO for Ethnic Diversity rather than “led by.” SM concurred.
- Vote to approve or reject: approved.
- **Motion:** Period Poverty - expiring motion (Immanuella Oba)
 - VP Welfare asked for motion to be continued in following years. There has been progress for project, but motion is to push for continuation of project and to ensure project is properly implemented.
 - CVP supports motion.
 - Vote to approve or reject: approved.
- **Motion:** Reproductive Health (Immanuella Oba)
 - VP Welfare stated that motion must be passed, motion proposed reproductive health campaign which will focus on RH issues faced by students.
 - Chosen officer can run campaign how they choose but campaign is needed to disseminate information and spread awareness.
 - Vote to approve or reject: passed.
- **Motion:** Transition to sustainable plant-based options in canteens (Mina Eusebio)
 - CVP stated we are in climate crisis and students across 24 universities have voted in favour of fully plant-based catering. This is in line with TUD’s commitment to sustainability and adding options for folks with dietary issues.
 - Is cheaper and healthier and increasing plant-based diets will support climate justice. TUD will be trailblazer amongst universities as first in Ireland to make this transition.
 - Councillor Christopher McL. expressed support and stated there are a lack of vegan options at TUD canteens.
 - Councillor Aleksander B. expressed support.
 - Vote to approve or reject: approved.
- **Motion:** Blanchardstown Transport (Naomi Sebastine)
 - President stated that motion is being resubmitted, mandates Blanch Campus VP to increase frequency of buses and mandates them to lobby for an improved shuttle bus system as prices are higher than TFI bus and doesn’t include 90 minutes policy.
 - Councillors Georgina B. and Christopher McL. expressed support.
 - Vote to approve or reject: approved.
